How are you at interruptions?

In my office, I have a personal open door policy. The only time my doors are closed is when I am on a phone, having a Zoom call, or I am not in the office. What always amazes me is when people come into my office, the first thing they says is "Sorry to bother you..." Yes, I had to stop what I was doing, look up, and greet the person who had entered my room. I was interrupted, but are interruptions all that bad?

Jesus would say, "NO!"

You would be surprised how many times Jesus was interrupted during his ministry.

By a Centurion (Matt. 8:5-13)

By Peter's mother in law (Matt. 8:14-15)

By the disciples (Matt. 8:25)

By demon possessed man (Matt 8:28-34)

By a paralyzed man (Matt 9:1-8)

By Jarius and the woman with blood (Matt 9:18-26)

By two blind men (Matt 9:27-31)

By Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52)

By children (Matt 19:13-15)

When Jesus came to earth he had an important mission to accomplish for his Father. Why would he allow his schedule be interrupted by so many people and personal issues?

There is a valuable lesson for us here. **People are more important than programs or agendas**. In the same way Jesus turned his attention to someone who interrupted what he was doing, we must do the same. Jesus put people ahead of programs. He constantly pivoted from what he was doing to the person right in front of him.

It's easy to put our agendas ahead of the people in our lives. The busier we become, the easier it is to miss the needs of the person right in front of us.

The other day, I called an auto dealer for a service appointment. I could not be booked until 10 days from now. I asked, "why so long?" She said that usually they are very busy, and it often takes 2 weeks to actually get an appointment. I guess I needed to be thankful that she was offering me 10 days rather than 14 days out. However, I felt like I was bothering them. They did not apologize for the inconvenience, they simply communicated to me that they were very busy. (continued)

When people look upon us, do they see someone who is too busy that cannot respond to their needs? I hope not!

We must see people through the eyes of Jesus, always pausing to take the second glance, and asking God to give us the change of heart to stop and address of the person in front of us.

To make people more important than whatever program, schedule or agenda you are pursuing, simply ask God to help you to become aware – to "see" the children, neighbors, co-workers, people in high or low positions and put their needs ahead of your agenda.


